Dear Richard:

Your letter of the 4th (stamped 7th & received 11th) delighted me, and not only because PRAXIS INTERNATIONAL will publish my essay on Marx's "New Humanism" and the Dialectics of Women's Liberation in Primitive and Modern Societies but because it re-establishes contact between us on an international basis. The fact that Mikhailo was the "mediation" in that is important to me. As you know from way back when, next to Marx-Hegel as the centerpoint of my preoccupation, the East European revolutionaries are the initiators of a totally new movement from practice that was itself a form of theory and impelled the theoreticians to develop into philosophers of freedom in those dark US 1950s when McCarthyism, on the one hand, and tired ideologues who were proclaiming "an end to ideology." At the conference just ended they were about the only ones who were serious enough about theory to make no division between that and practice.

Enclosed is the copyright assignment form duly filled out.

As for the line identifying me, the focus should be on me as author of my latest work, ROSA LUXEMBURG, Women's Liberation and Marx's Philosophy of Revolution. I would appreciate it also if you listed that the Wayne State University Labor Archives have available on microfilm nearly 1/2 c. of documents I deposited with them under the title: "The Raya Dunayevskaya Collection--Marxist-Humanism in the United States, 1941 to Today." (Actually the reason the title singles out the year 1941 is that is when I first became an independent Marx with my study of the nature of state-capitalist society, Russia, but included in it are part of the 1930s, esp. letters from and to Leon Trotsky.)

I take for granted that though you are editing out the reference to the conference, you are not counting out from that first paragraph what is the center of my whole study, Marx's Ethnohistorical Epochs.

I am also enclosing the brochure Humanities Press put out, should you be interested in any facts there. Do let me know, if you are interested, whether you have my latest work. If not, I shall be glad to send you a copy.
