Dear Mrs. Dunayevskaya

I should have written sooner to thank you for sending the additional sections of your Mss. and to say how much I enjoyed our brief meeting.

I have read the whole of your Mss. with great attention and interest and with a good deal of agreement. Not being a philosopher, I shall not venture an opinion on the most contentious of your theses, i.e. that Lenin modified his Marxism in the light of his re-reading of Hegel in the autumn of 1914. But you have raised enough doubt to cause anyone concerned to look at this question again-- and I shall certainly do so when I have a little more leisure.
