Shut the Schools Down! Attack Univ. Involvement in the War

Tonight, May 8, Nixon announced he is putting mines in N. Vietnam ports to stop supplies, bombing any ships that try to get into those ports and increasing bombing flights over N. Vietnam.

This is an entirely new escalation of the war. The government is on a head-on collision course with Russia. Within days the U.S. government might be using nuclear weapons on the Vietnamese. And all this to satisfy the interests of a few giant corporations.

THIS IS IT. The U.S. government has set the stage for nuclear war in Vietnam -- for WWII.

THERE IS NOTHING for workers and students to do INTERNATIONALLY but carry out a **GENERAL STRIKE** to push the Government and the rich businessmen who back it over on their fat asses and **FORCE** the U.S. Out of S.E. Asia NOW!!!

STUDENTS AND WORKERS MUST STRIKE NOW.

On Campus:

- 1) Shut down the schools -- shut them tight -- **ON STRIKE!!!**
- 2) SDS and other groups should call rallies and then **massive strike meetings** and vote to **shut the schools down tight!** AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. If possible, a good place to hold these meetings is the administration building or the ROTC building. In any case, hold the meeting somewhere.

- 3) These meetings should make concrete plans for demanding an end to university's involvement in the war effort, (example: ROTC on campus, war research, military recruiters, government institutes like the Institute for Defense Analysis at Columbia University, pro-war speakers, etc.)
SHUT THE SCHOOL DOWN TILL:

- a) the university ends their involvement in the war.
- b) the unbelievable escalation ends and the U.S. gets OUT of Vietnam.

- 4) Apart from holding key buildings where it's possible, striking students, faculty and campus workers can set up **MILITANT picket lines** at the administration building, classroom buildings, etc. -- no scabs on this strike -- **DON'T LET ADMINISTRATORS BY** (a strike is not a strike when you let the management in).

Students shouldn't get by these picket lines either. The strike must continue. There should be **NO CLASSES** as long as this infamous policy continues by the U.S. government.

- 5) **BUILD WORKER-STUDENT ALLIANCE... ANY STOPPAGE OF WORK** by any workers is a blow against this war....

Go out to workers on the campuses, in our communities, at factory gates, etc., with leaflets talking about the war and calling on them to **STRIKE** for the U.S. out of S.E. Asia, NOW!!!

The power to stop this war lies in the hands of the working class. Workers pay for it, workers die in it, here and in Vietnam. And the rich grow richer. Above all else, this is a war against working people here and in Vietnam. Not just a businessman's war, but a racist, anti-working class war. If we, as students can help encourage or support any action by any working people, whether teachers, factory workers or welfare mothers, these actions (specifically if they involve strikes) can and **WILL** encourage other workers and students so that a working class movement of rallies, protests and **STRIKES** against the war can spread and **FORCE** these criminals out of S.E. Asia. They've been attacking working people long enough.....

VIETNAM A Racist War

Asian people are being murdered by the U.S. government in Vietnam. At the same time, the government is banking on racism -- contempt for the lives of Vietnamese people -- to help keep the lid on at home.

Aside from the fact that the loyalty of the U.S. soldier is highly questionable (!) the government knows the American people won't tolerate sending hundreds of thousands of troops to be killed in Vietnam. So, the current escalation aimed at holding onto S.E. Asia relies on massive bombings, confrontations with Russia and the threat of nuclear weapons.

Atomic weapons in Vietnam means racist genocide. We must smash the government's attempts to divide workers and students in the U.S. and Canada, etc., from workers, peasants and students in Vietnam.

The image of the Vietnamese as dull, inscrutable and indifferent sub-humans, (which we get alot of from the press and in textbooks) has got to be destroyed. These anti-imperialist fighters in Vietnam are our brothers and sisters.

MAY DAY-Internat'l Solidarity Day

May Day is the international holiday of workers and their allies around the world. It has been since 1886 when workers battled cops in Chicago in the fight for the 8 hour work day.

This year, SDSers joined with members of the Vietnam Veterans against the War, Progressive Labor Party, the Chicago Coalition against the Cuts, the Workers' Action Movement, the Bronx Workers and Clients against Lay-offs and Cutbacks and many other groups and individuals at each of the five May Day demonstrations held April 29 in Houston, Los Angeles, Seattle, Toronto and Washington, D. C.

Over 4,000 workers and students marched in a show of solidarity with the people of the world against attacks made on them by the U.S. government.

SDS banners and flags carried slogans like "Fight Racism," "Students and Workers Unite" and "STRIKE for U.S. Out of S.E. Asia Now". The demonstrators were enthusiastically received by members of the largely black and latin communities through which the marches took place; in many cases, workers raised their fists in solidarity with the marchers and joined the march.

In a rally on the steps of the Capitol in Washington, D.C., the SDS speaker demanded: "U.S. Out of S.E. Asia Now" and called for a student strike against the universities participation with the war.

After a picnic, everyone returned home with new determination and plans for fighting the government and college administrators responsible for the oppression of people around the world.

It was a worker-student alliance demonstration in a true spirit of international solidarity.

McGOVERN urged Americans not to react "in blind fury and damaging demonstrations." Instead, he urged quiet and firm action for a "new agenda" in 1972 to end the war.

The sole purpose of the move, he maintained, was to keep the Saigon regime "in power a little longer and perhaps to save Mr. Nixon's face a little longer."

Gov. George Wallace of Alabama said at a news conference that he would support McGovern.
