HOW CHICAGO POLICE GUARD SCAB NEWS STANDS

GREATEST STRIKE IN CHICAGO'S HISTORY IS AIMED AT ITS PRESS

(National Labor Syndicate) The greatest strike in the history of Chicago is now in full blast. The greatest because unlike all other strikes, this is directed at the very center of the capitalist fortress, its hypocritical and prostituted press. Less than 2,000 men are actually cut off from their jobs, but all Chicago is taking sides.

Out of it has emerged the Daily Worker, formerly the Daily Socialist, a paper six weeks ago of less than 40,000 circulation, and living a more or less hand-to-mouth existence, but which now has more circulation than it can handle here in detail. Suffice to say that it began with the lockout of the pressmen in the offices of the Hearst Examiner and the American. When Hearst broke into the Chicago newspaper field he refused to have any connection with the Chicago Publishers' association, the capitalist union of the big Chicago magazines. He announced with a blare of trumpets that his was to be an organ of the working class—a union man's paper. The contract he made with his pressmen was more liberal than that made by the other publishers. This was in the days when Hearst was nursing a boom to be the Democratic Roosevelt of America, when with his skillful editor, he was appealing to every prejudice he could arouse.

Since those days Hearst has changed his tactics. An inheritance of millions in land and money, employing thousands of workmen, he found it more to his advantage to play the capitalist side of the game than that of the working class. From a labor lover he has become a labor hater. The story of the striking workmen in his lead (N. D.) mines, where he has tried to exterminate the organization of the Western Federation of Miners; his taking the side of Otis in the conflict at Los Angeles, Cal., is now superseding his latest move in establishing his eye shop in the printing trades of Chicago.

For back of this strike in Chicago that is what is involved. This is the Chicago strike of the American Federation of Labor, and shared by a large part of the Hearst public.

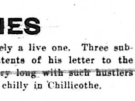
