TORMENTING JOBBERS WORKERS

Are you out of a job? It's your own fault. There's plenty of work in Buffalo. We have it direct from George C. Lehman, commissioner of industries for the Chamber of Commerce.

The game of the Buffalo capitalists, including the newspaper owners, is clear enough to the workman with a spoonful of brains. Where the competition for jobs is keenest, wages can be kept at the lowest level.

Yet the Chamber of Commerce, through its toadying newspapers, does not hesitate to insult your intelligence with this absurd whining about good times, and plenty of work.

Think of it! Five hundred men, not merely willing to take that most slavish of jobs, subject to daily cursing and abuse, fed like cattle on the worst of food, worked like beasts of burden, day and night, merely willing to take such work but fighting, scrambling and clawing one another for the chance on Niagara Square in this city of perennial prosperity and towering wages!

Turn loose the Red Gospel! The country is hungry for it! If you vote for capitalist "prosperity" this year and get "laved off," don't kick—you voted for it.

According to the new revelation! man is the primary, the supreme and the eternal, and the law the secondary, temporary and transitory element—Dietzen.

A great many men who talk and spout about standing with the working class 364 days in the year desert on election day, turn traitor, and vote for the capitalist exploiters.

The class that benefited most by solving the problem of production took pains to do it, using the workers to do the dirty work. Now it is up to the class that will benefit by solving the problem of distribution to get at it and do some work for themselves.

RELIGION IN POLITICS — AN OLD RUSE OF THE MASTERS

Much is made of the fact that President Taft sent an ambassador to the pope and appointed a Catholic to be chief justice of the supreme court. What of it? When you strike, does not the Catholic fellow-worker strike just as enthusiastically as you do? "The love of Christ," which the parsons say is all that is needed to make everything lovely in the world—did you ever know a capitalist master to get it hard enough to send to his workmen's demands for better wages on that account of his workmen's love of Christ?

It has always been a favorite scheme of the masters to keep the workers divided. Anything to make one group of workers hate the other group—whether it be religion, or nationality, or race, or color—is satisfactory to the masters—so long as the workers fight each other.

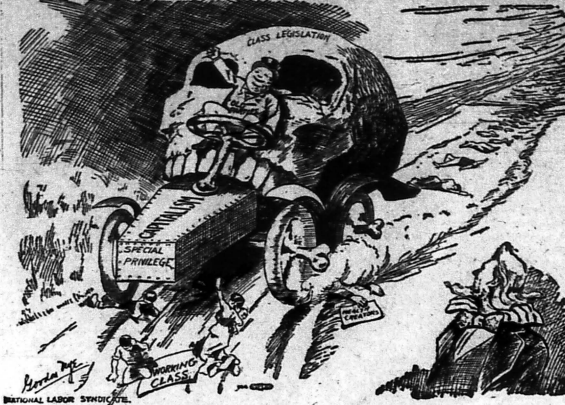
If the workers will only hate one another, they will be too busy to see how the master class is robbing them. The two things most to be feared by the workers are: (1) A high political tariff devoted to the interests of the workers alone, and one big union which will not permit of craft jurisdiction quarrels and the scabbing by one union upon another.

If you want to please your exploiters, just fall in with their scheme of making religion an issue in the campaign.

Religion has about as much to do with the real issue in this campaign, so far as the working class is concerned, as the color of the candidates' eyes, or whether he prefers pink pajamas or the flouging nightgown.

The only issue for the working class is this: Shall the workers of all races and all religions combine to seize the reins of authority, control the tools which they must use in order to live, and establish economic justice upon the earth, or shall the shirkers of all religions continue to rule the world and murder by wholesale their wretched victims in mill and mine and sweatshop?

The Socialist party stands squarely on the issue and refuses to be led into the devious byways of religious disputes which start in the cunning brains of capitalist schemers and lead nowhere.



CAPITALISM'S JOY RIDE

HAYWOOD THE "PUZZLE"

During the last few months—in short, since the Lawrence strike—the capitalist newspapers and magazines have dwelt, with something of nervous apprehension, something of critical interest, something of the feeling arising at the reckless-devils-for-letting—his name appear in the paper, upon the personality of Big Bill Haywood, leader of strikes and inspiration of the working class.

Without their experience in the maze of political cross-purposes, without their knowledge of the cunning trickery of capitalism, coming back to the simple common sense of the proletarian, they could understand it readily. Really, Bill Haywood's power is a very easy thing to understand, when you stop thinking of him as a riddle. Here is the answer:

Bill Haywood's power among the working class is based upon the fact that he isn't "playing any game." He is honest to the core and his heroes instinctively feel it. When he opens his mouth, he looks his auditors squarely in the face, and the quiver of every muscle in the frame of the giant speaks the sincerity of his purpose and the courage of his deed. He says the working class, simply because he doesn't play at the game of swaying them, but naturally strikes an answer to the words which, since the experience has been the experience of the

working class the world over. From the time Bill opened his mouth to speak, he is an common ground with the workers of every tongue.

When the toilers cheer the utterances of Haywood, they are cheering and exulting in the expression of their class consciousness. The philosophy of Haywood is the philosophy of the masses, which has as yet found few prophets and fewer interpreters. He develops within the mass the consciousness of its own strength, whether there be leaders or no leaders. He has as much contempt for leaders and leadership as the syrochastic time-serverers of the press have honor for them.

And this, dear puzzled adherents of Haywood, is the secret of Haywood's strength.
