THE PASSING MEER

With a degree of amused curiosity, we have watched the antics of the capitalist newspapers in reporting the death of J. Pierpont Morgan. There were no eulogies to the ruler which he died in spirit and which were in operation.

All of the capitalist newspapers indulged in fulsome eulogies of the dead banker of America. It was because of the time-honored adage to "speak no ill of the dead!" Certainly not. It was because the heirs of Morgan controlled banks from which the capitalist newspapers expect to get the necessary credits to continue business.

Page after page and column after column were allotted to slavish eulogies of the manipulator who, by reason of the super-development of that sub-section of the brain called animal cunning, had succeeded in bestriding the top-rungs of capitalist industry and robbing the working class of a larger proportion of its product than any of his fellows.

Yet, the most striking feature of Morgan's progress was wholly ignored. That feature was "How he got his start." Those of us who have read Comrade Gustav Meyer's splendid "History of the Great American Fortune," published by Kerr & Co., the Socialist co-operative publishing house, KNOW, file get his start during the Civil War when working class bores were rushing to the front to get shot either in defense of the Southern's chattel slaves, or in defense of the Northern's war for slave-every. Morgan "did" do any "rushing to the front" that could be noticed. What Morgan "the philanthropist" did was to sneak into the "market" in New York City and buy 20,000 CONDEMNED RIFLES. They were in such rotten condition that even a government would have a depleted treasury and a broken army would not use them after buying them. Morgan got them at \$3.75 each, shipped them to St. Louis and SOLD THEM back to the government, TO THE ARMY OF THE WEST, AT \$22 each. He recently collected the last \$7 per gun of the bloody-money of the soldiers, through his legal counsel.

So you see, there is no Mr. Morgan's life which are not bought out in the capitalist game. Mr. Morgan was a good deal like the rest of the robbers. He got away with a little more than the rest,—that's the only difference.

BACK TO 1865, GO THE AGILE COURTS!

Driven to desperation by the onrush of the embattled working class, the lawyers of the masters called judges often to go to great lengths to save the capitalists from embarrassments. At Paterson, N. J., last week, one of the judges tried Comrade Hayward, an I. W. W. leader, on the charge of "leading an unlawful assemblage," and convicted him. In order to secure the only "precedent" available, it was necessary to go back to the year 1868, when, in the reign of King Charles I, a judicial judge handed down a similar decision.

Did this mean the "honorable" court? Not so you could notice it! Finding that there was only one way to put the fighting miser out of the way, the New Jersey judge went to the aid of King Charles I to turn the trick! When the bosses want to get a fighting leader of the working class they resort to many devious means.

This attack could not be better timed. Assuming that because the Socialist Party, for reasons of its own had decided to recall Hayward from office back to the courts, the capitalists evidently assumed that this would be a good time to strike!

Let them not feel too secure in their sinuous cunning! Nothing could so effectively close up the ranks in the working class movement as an attack of this character upon our militant working class leader, whichever way the trick is pulled. Socialists are not of the stripe to put tactics above principle. The Jersey judge may be reeking without his host.

THE STRUGGLE ABOARD.

On this side the Atlantic find it difficult to realize the tremendous struggle that is going on in Europe between the forces of revolution and the forces of the master class. In Germany, for example, the Socialist Party numbers fully a million dues-paying members and casts approximately four and one-half million votes. The German Socialists are not only the largest party in the world, and they are by no means without active opposition. This opposition is chiefly militaristic, according to one of the local capitalist papers, whose Berlin correspondent, or to speak more accurately, the hack newspaper writer in New York who writes the column on the German "Berlin correspondence," who let the cat out of the bag a few days ago.

It appears that only by the utmost vigilance and the most ardent exercise of power is the Kaiser kept on his tottering throne. In addition to the standing army, the Kaiser depends upon the so-called "military organizations," consisting of ex-soldiers to the number of 2,500,000 to keep the working class in subjection. Socialists are carefully kept out of these military clubs, in the fear that anything like open discussion would speedily win them also over to the party of freedom.

They are engaged, with the active aid of all government officials, in hampering and harassing and brow-beating the Socialists; but the work of education and organization goes steadily on,—just as the work of organizing the street-railways of Buffalo has gone steadily on, in spite of the bullying vigilance of police, newspapers, preachers and courts of Buffalo.

However, let us pass. Come now to the effects of this most glorious boon. Let us see how it has worked out elsewhere. In Cleveland, the electric light rate is even lower than "our" new rate of 7 cents per kilowatt, 5 cents, if our memory serves.

The route to be followed on the way to salvation is not three-cent fare, government ownership of railroads or 50-cent gas. Nope. It's 7-cent electricity! Won't that be lovely!

The capitalist papers have printed glowing accounts of the delightful times in store when "our" light bills are not down to \$1.40 a month instead of \$1.80, and some homes are already congratulating themselves on eight more hours of bread a month! We used the word "our" rather recklessly in the above paragraph. It has just dawned upon us that the proletariat doesn't use electric light to any great extent.

And ye, strange to relate, we have poverty in Cleveland! We, sir,—regular human poverty,—name brand as we have in Buffalo. Likewise they have that glorious 3-cent fare in Cleveland.

And in the meantime, the General Electric will more than make it up in increased patronage, due to the free advertising in the capitalist dailies, and so harm will be done to the person or property of any single pilot!
