Bosses Refuse Paltry Increase

Unable to Live on Wages Men Strike for Enough for a Mere Existence—Long Hours of Work at Hard Labor Drives Men to Desperation.

After exhausting every effort to avert a strike of the Teamsters' Union, Organizer Farrell has called out the men. On Monday morning about 1,800 teamsters quit work in order to bring from the losses an extra dollar a week which they must have if they are to keep their bodies in a condition fit to do the heavy work which is expected of them.

MACHINISTS UNION WINNING STRIKE

The strike of the Machinists' Union has resulted in victory for the men. All but a very few shops have agreed to the demands, and it is expected that the balance will soon fall in line.

Men working at such work consume considerable fuel with the present high cost of living costing a minute how a man can live on even the wages asked.

One of the best proofs of where Col. Ward of the Department of Public Works stands towards labor is his leniency towards Mosler & Summers, the contractors on the new Technical High School.

New Trades and Labor Council

In response to a call issued by organizers representing the American Federation of Labor, many delegates, representing a majority of the union men in this city, gathered at Schollback's hall, Broadway and Ash streets, last Tuesday evening.

The contractors agreed to have the Technical School ready for the fall term, but through the dispute over the eight hour law the school will not be ready until next August. Now the Colonel says "that although there is a time clause in the contract which provides for the completion of the building by September 1st, it is not believed that the contractors will be penalized on account of the labor difficulties with the Carpenter Union."

The organization of the new Central Trades Council in Buffalo means the doom of the C. I. O. and of the miners, and is a victory for the Buffalo Socialist.

FUHRMANN IS THE THIRD ARBITRATOR

Through the failure of the two men appointed to select third man to arbitrate the differences of the street car interests of the men at a disadvantage, Louis P. Fuhrmann becomes the third arbitrator.

STREET RAILWAY FIRES LICKSPITTLES

Prior to the street car strike the Buffalo Socialist said that on the organization of the men the lickspittles in the company's employ would go by the board. And that is what has happened.

Edward D. Jackson represents the men, and Bert L. Jones the Company, which gives the capitalist class the better of the game. Jones and Fuhrmann represent the capitalist class and Jackson the working class which places the interests of the men at a disadvantage, and the only chance for a square deal for the men is the fear of political deception for Fuhrmann if he does not show himself to be a man for the job.

These men were put forward to do the dirty work of the effort to prevent the organization of the men and afterwards during the strike. Their antagonism of the men in this way has brought about their discharge. It is necessary to have officials who will work in harmony with the men.

On the other hand Fuhrmann must do the bidding of the stockholders of the International or the newspaper proprietors and politicians who have money invested in it will prevent him from obtaining the nomination for mayor this fall.

Fuhrmann had a good chance to show where he stood during the strike but failed to accept. Keep your eye on him now that he is in a position to do something.

FROM 1 TO 15 YEARS FOR SOCIALIST EDITOR

Such in part is the ringing deft of Alexander Scott, editor of the Weekly Issue, official organ of the Socialist party in Passaic County, New Jersey. At Paterson on Friday Scott was given an indeterminate state prison sentence of not more than fifteen years, nor less than one year and fined \$250. He was immediately banished on a writ of error in the amount of \$4,000.



CHARLES H. BOSWELL, editor of the Labor Argus, the Socialist weekly of Charleston, West Virginia, has again been arrested on a warrant sworn out by Thomas Haggerty, international board member of the United Mine Workers of America. Ball was obtained.

Haggerty charges that he was originally libeled by Boswell in the latter's attack on the strike settlement arranged by the coal barons, mine officials and Governor Hatfield. Boswell showed that the alleged settlement brought the miners little as the fruit of their long struggle.

After an hour and a half of conference, even all the miners who had been found guilty by court-martial and sentenced to from five to fourteen years for shooting were released. Hundreds of these miners were suffering the tortments of hell. But some of the mine guards and even a mine superintendent, who preyed upon mine oppressed, and who shot, beat and killed at will, are still in service.

Slaves in Reality. "West Virginia is practically a czar's country and the conditions there are deplorable, for the workers are practically slaves of the mining industry," declared Berger. "The Duke of Abruzzi and king of Italy are supposed to own land in the coal district as well as the German and English lords, along with the Standard Oil company, the Guggenheims and Boston and New York capitalists, and there is reality very little other work to be had except work in the mines."

The Baldwin-Felts guards are mostly former jail birds, thugs and desperadoes, who get \$75 a month and board, such form the private army of the coal companies.

"The purpose of all these demons is to keep away from those who endeavor to organize the miners. The coal corporation even owns the homes or huts in which the workers live, and when a contract is signed, a clause is inserted that any person who is not allowed to stay overnight in the house. There was a case cited in the mining industry. One of the miners stayed overnight. He was favorable to the union, it was later discovered, and the miner who sheltered him was beaten up."

"One can not imagine the power of the mining company in this district," continued Berger. "It elects senators and judges. It owns both the Republic and the Democratic party in the state. All laws are made to suit the mine owners. All the judges are elected through their influence, even up to the justices of the supreme court. Such are the conditions we were met with, face to face."

"There is also this to be considered—in other states the mine workers are in the hands of the foreigners, while in West Virginia fully 95 per cent of the miners are natives. They used to own the hills, but are now slaves to the treasures contained in the hills. Warfare has been on foot since the oppression by the owners of the black diamonds. It was a bloody war between the mountaineers and the mine guards, especially during the last year."

"Ball Moose Armored Special," he said. "When the so-called Bull Moose Special, an armored train, went through these districts last February, the thugs used the gassing guns on every place where there was a light. This was during the night, of course, while the miners and their families were trying to get a little rest they could. The guns were turned on the cabins and the tents, and the men, women and innocent children were shot down, while the mountaineers kept their lights low so that the miners could not respond to the fire. This happened last February, before Gov. Hatfield left office."

"I talked with women who had gone through this terrible sleep, and shook hands with those who will carry bullet marks with them all through life. Some were crippled for life."

"The state of West Virginia will have to change the character of the ownership of the mines to bring the real change and freedom of the miners, and that will have to be through the state legislature."

"With the committee investigation ordered by the United States senate, many more things will be revealed, and the system as operated in West Virginia will be clear up to the neck as hardly credible, in a day of supposed political freedom under the constitution of the United States."
