### Socialists Make Stand Against Capitalist Rule

Eleven People Arrested at Lafayetie Square Yesterday Noon -- Bystanders Also Pulled In.

Yesterday noon Lafayette Square was the scene of police rule of the City of Buffalo.

Eleven people who had determined to take advantage of their constitutional rights were dragged off to the police station in the patrol wagon by a picked set of policemen noted for their brutal methods in handling the people of the waterfront.

When W. F. Cattell of the Buffalo Socialist mounted the stand to introduce the first speaker, he was taken from his position and arrested. Stephen J. Mahoney, Socialist candidate for Mayor, who was arrested the day before was the next to take the stand and received the same treatment. Max Sherover was the next followed by Patrick O'Brien of No. 91 W. Mohawk Street; Samuel Leary of No. 798 Sencea Street; Daniel A. Niel of Jamestown; W. S. Barnhard, candidate for Congress on the Socialist ticket in the First District of Illinois; Marie Gnosa and Căroline Welty of No. 141 Riverside Avenue; Frank W. Saunders, Jawyer, of No. 302 Brishane Building.

Innocent bystanders were treated like cattle by the police, who were led by that famous brute Sergeant Higgins, and in the case of Lawyer Saunders, Officer Pine unnecessarily manhandled him going so far as to make an idiot of himself and deliberately jumping on the man's hat like a tough kid.
