LUETGERT'S KIN KILLS HIMSELF

Was Brother of Man Convicted of Destroying Wife in a Sausage Vat

Arnold Luetgert, brother of the north side sausage manufacturer, who was convicted to serve a life sentence in Joliet for the murder of his wife, committed suicide by shooting himself in Elgin late yesterday afternoon.

Hides His Identity

He was taken to the hospital, but died within an hour without regaining consciousness. The identity of Luetgert was not known until today.

Sees Childhood Scenes

He went to Elgin a few days ago and visited the scenes of his childhood and youth. Yesterday, before going to Lord's park, he went to see the home in which he lived years ago and in which his son was born.

History of Former Tragedy

Adolph Luetgert, brother of the suicide of today, was a manufacturer of sausages in Diversy boulevard when he was convicted of the murder of his wife, Louisa, who was strangled with death and her body disintegrated with the aid of chemicals on the night of May 1, 1897.

Convicted by Human Bone

An investigation was made and a single human bone, declared to be that of Mrs. Luetgert, was found in a sausage vat. This bone caused the conviction of the husband.

"This year, however, the situation is so bad that the unemployed act has broken down. It is clearly evident already that the powers conferred on the local authorities under the act will be totally and completely ineffective."

A few days ago a mob of 15,000 unemployed men in Glasgow, led by well known Socialists and singing revolutionary songs, started on a midnight march from the center of the town to the district inhabited by the wealthy citizens.
