German Miners Demand That the Inspectors Be Taken From Their Ranks

Germany, June 25.—The subject of the protection of mine workers was brought up at the International congress by Florens, one of the Belgian delegates. In introducing this subject the Belgian delegate declared that the recent mine horrors in Germany at Badob and Hamm and in Austria at Wegg, as well as the salt mine horror near Craiova, made necessary a demand that the International congress of mine workers formulate in their platform a demand for the appointment of mine inspectors who should be drawn from the ranks of the workmen themselves.

MINE HORRORS DOUBLED

Smiley, the English delegate; Rymer, representing the Poles, and Jarolin of Austria supported the motion of Clarkson. # 7,000 CHICAGO STORES UNCLEAN

Out of This Number of Insanitary Places Only 390 Are Bettered

supplement which has been issued to one of the annual reports of the city shows that there are more than 7,000 insanitary stores in the city of Chicago where foodstuffs are sold, and that all the machinery of the city was only able to correct the abuses in the cases of 390 of these stores during the year ending March 31, 1909. The fines collected from insanitary stores amounted to only \$2,340.

As a matter of fact, the report only shows the stores which were inspected upon complaints made of insanitary conditions and that there are many insanitary stores which have never been reported or complained of is not to be doubted, according to Dr. L. Blake Baldwin of the health department.

**Poor the Victims as Usual**  
The insanitary stores include bakeries, meat shops, groceries, milk depots and stores of every kind where food is sold. By far the larger bulk of the insanitary stores are located in the poorer districts of the city and the food going out from these unhealthy holes is poisoning the poorer people of the city by thousands and causing a spread of disease of various kinds which has alarmed the authorities and caused a hurry-up call to be sent out only last week for a number of new city hospitals to take care of certain types of disease which have their origin in the insanitary stores.

**Halsted Street the Worst**  
In the number of insanitary food stores, Halsted street runs a trifle ahead of two other big city thoroughfares, Milwaukee avenue and State street. On all three of these streets the stores were found by hundreds by the inspectors who were investigating the complaints. More than 14,000 complaints were received of store conditions by the inspectors and more than 16,000 of these complaints were run, with the result that exactly 6,333 of the stores were found to be in such a condition that the food sold from them was dangerous to the public health.
