Under the title of "Proposed Question of Public Policy No. 1," the voters of the state of Illinois will be asked next Tuesday to either vote in favor of, or reject a proposition asking the state Legislature to amend the state constitution with a provision calling for the adoption of the "Initiative and Referendum."

SOCIALIST IN SHERIFF'S JOB

Van Bodegraven, As Workers Candidate, Gives "Party's" Stand

For several years the workmen of the city of Chicago have been victims of the sheriff's willingness to give the power of deputy sheriffs to strikebreakers, who were thus allowed by the city police to ride on wagons armed with rifles, or on taxicabs armed with clubs.

Right to Arm Thugs This means that every time a union man strikes there is a chance for his employer to go to the sheriff of Cook County and gain the legal right to arm thugs to use against the strikers.

Boes Would Plead in Vain A Socialist, if elected as sheriff of this county would refuse to give deputy sheriffs' stars to strikebreakers.

Remember Election Day We are informed that the employing interests in the present garment workers' strike went to the sheriff's office to have their strike breakers deputized and the sheriff suddenly remembered that election day comes on Nov. 8.

Other Candidates Dodges To the query of the Chicago Federation of Labor as to whether or not they would deputize strike breakers as members of the sheriff's staff, Michael Zimmer, democratic candidate, and Frank Vogler, republican candidate, have both sent replies dodging the direct issue, but letting it be understood in a vague way that either one would be the actual sheriff of the county and giving the general understanding each would confine his activities to his work as an aid of the courts.

LIEBKNECHT, LEADER OF YOUNG PEOPLE, TO SPEAK



Son of Famous German Socialist to Aid in Campaign.

The economic competition between nations is the prime cause both of racial hatred and of the maintenance of great armies and navies, according to Karl Liebknecht, the Socialist member of the Prussian Landtag, who will speak at the Garrick theater, Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

As the leader in the Socialist Young People's organization, the noted German statesman comes face to face with the compulsory military service which prevails in most of the European nations.

The enormous burden which the taxes for military purposes impose on the people is always a spectacular argument in proving that the capitalists use the political power of the state for the "good of trade."

In a report to the convention of the Young People's organization at Copenhagen, Liebknecht showed that each nation is perfectly willing for the sake of profits to sell war machinery to another nation.

Liebknecht speaks in Cincinnati, O., on the fourth; Davenport, Ia., on the fifth, and on the afternoon of the sixth in Milwaukee.
