INDICTED WORKERS APPEAL TO BROTHERS

Haywood, Trautman and Yates Assure Toilers of Their Innocence.

LAWRENCE, Mass., May 2.—In the name of industrial freedom the Committee of the Etor-Giovanitti Defense League consisting of William D. Haywood, William E. Trautman, Elizabeth Gurley Flynn and William Yates have issued the following appeal:

Fellow Workers and Comrades—As was to be expected, the mill owners of Lawrence and other points, defeated by the workers in open conflict, have rushed to the blindfolded Goddess of Law to secure bail for their wounded hearts.

Besides this, we, together with a number of other fellow workers, have been further indicted on numerous counts for "conspiracy."

Because of the workers' struggle, in which we enjoyed their confidence and played a prominent part, \$15,000,000 increase in wages annually will be reaped by the textile workers of New England and there will be that much less profit to the capitalists.

Now that the struggle is over it is proposed that we shall pay the price for our ideals and activities. It is the duty of the great tribunal of labor and of all who sympathize with labor's aspirations for a better day...

We are innocent of any crime. We have fought like good soldiers and with the clean weapon of working class solidarity against enormous wealth surrounded by thugs with guns and clubs in a forest of bayonets...

Therefore, we hope that as in the past workers never appealed to us in vain for support in their cause, so now you will support us in this, our hour of supreme need.
