THE RUSSIAN REVOLUTION

Thanks to the military censorship of all overseas news very little is known at the present writing about the actual outcome of the upheaval in Russia...

It is reported that plans have been made to convene a Constitutional Assembly which will be to decide the future form of Russia's government which will, in all probability, be similar to that of Mexico...

Following a period of strikes and bread-riots in Petrograd, in which the soldiers fraternized with the throngs of workers in the streets...

The following declaration of principles was issued: First—An immediate general amnesty for all political and religious offenses...

Second—Liberty of speech and of the press; freedom of alliances, unions, and strikes, with the extensions of these liberties to military officials within the limits admitted by military requirements.

Third—Abolition of all social, religious, and national restrictions.

Fourth—To present authority to the preparation and convocation of a constitutional assembly, based on universal suffrage, which will establish a governmental regime.

Fifth—The substitution of the police by a national militia, with chiefs to be elected and responsible to the Government.

Sixth—Communal elections to be based on universal suffrage.

Seventh—The troops which participated in the revolutionary movement will not be disbanded, but will remain in Petrograd.

Eighth—While maintaining strict military discipline for troops on active service, it is desirable to liberate soldiers all restrictions in the enjoyment of social rights accorded other citizens.

The Provisional Government desired to add that it has no intention to profit by the circumstances of the war to delay the realization of the measures of reform above mentioned.

In response to the declaration of amnesty for all offenses against the old autocracy, exiles are beginning to return from Siberia and abroad. To all appearances Russia is breaking the chains of Autocracy just at the time these chains are being forced upon the "sovereign American citizen"...
