

# THE GENOA FARCE ENDS

**T**HE GENOA FARCE has ended, just as we predicted, in our April 15th issue of the CHALLENGE, the conference was destined to fail, because of the irreconcilable contradictions existing in the capitalist system of wealth production. The gap that separated France from the rest of Europe could not be bridged by a merely economic conference. The agenda drawn up at Cannes to govern the actions of Genoa also foredoomed it to failure. It forbade discussion of those points that must be the basis for any temporary re-organization of Europe—the question of debts, reparations and to some extent of boundaries. The relegation of Russia to a secondary place on the agenda was a meaningless concession to France, as the whole of the conference was occupying to the extent that it concerned itself about constructive measures, with the problem of Russia.

The hypocritical desire for permanent World Peace expressed by the Allied delegates to discussing Genoa, before the conference at Cannes was exposed the first day when Tchitcherine proposed the discussion of disarmament. Concerning this day, PRAVDA, the organ of the Communist Party of Russia, declares that the capitalist nations exposed themselves as brigades, instead of saviors of the world, by their refusal to discuss disarmament.

While the WORKERS' CHALLENGE makes no campaign for support on the vain and various boasts that make our contemporaries the laughing stock of the intelligent portion of the working class, we can truthfully point to the fact that this was the only working class publication in the United States that correctly estimated the significance of Genoa and predicted with accuracy its miserable outcome. It was not because, as we were prophesied that we predicted the failure of Genoa, but because we were trained Marxists, who analyzed the contending forces and drew our scientific conclusions with almost the accuracy of a mathematician.

That Marathian organ of centrist fakism, known as THE WORKER, indulged in its customary naive stoniness in relation to Genoa, when it heralded it as "the first HONEST attempt of the European rulers to repair the damage of the war." The Marxist understands that in controversies of this sort the question of honesty and sincerity does not enter. Capitalist diplomacy is "beyond good and evil." The eighth week of the great mine strike has found the forces still intact and practically every coal mine on the North American continent at a standstill. The solidarity of those on strike is unswerving. The situation is growing more tense throughout all strike regions we have been able to receive reports from and it is likely that the next few weeks will develop some sharp struggles. The Coal and Iron Police, the cheap judicial hirelings of the Coal Trust, the State Constabulary and the whole aggregation of retainers of the capitalist class are preparing for action against the strikers. The provocative acts of the authorities are growing ever more frequent and violent and every day sees unprovoked assaults upon unoffensive strikers and their families. Murder, rape and pillage are the latest weapons used in this strike, though they are familiar weapons to the hands of the slavers of the coal and iron police. ## Ebert's "Socialist" Speech

The Social-Democratic fragment of the republic, Frederick Ebert, who represents the same tendency in the "World movement" as the Socialist Party of America, also spoke briefly, saying the altered political situation and the present economic conditions of the fatherland had been recognized by the Republican constitution which, he declared, provided a basis for the compromise between employers and workers.

Speaking at the luncheon, Stinnes

received, even in face of the economic collapse in Europe and the desperate straits to which she is put in order to maintain a semblance of stability. Nothing but the most desperate need would have forced the governments of England and Italy to arbitrate the Genoa conference. As the representative of the capitalist interests of Great Britain, is striving to defend England's place in Europe while maintaining a dominant position in Asia. The failure of the Treaty of Versailles, primarily due to the refusal of the United States to ratify it, has created a situation that is being suffered in Europe, into open hostility to each other. The Versailles treaty would have completely destroyed Germany, and reduced it to a vassal of the signatories. The contemplated pillaging of Germany would have enabled the victors to exploit the country to the limit and expand their industries. The conquest of Russia would have been the next step. The Russian debt to France would have been recognized, the finance capitalists of the United States would have collected their interest on their war loans and the balance of the world would have suffered in the hands of the super-government, the League of Nations. It was an ambitious dream of World-Imperialism, but the conflicts existing between various capitalist interests destroyed the work of Versailles.

The failure did not stop the striving for stabilization of European economy. The vast resources of Russia, must be tapped in order to help Europe out of her middle. The French chauvinists and the American and Japanese Imperialists pursued a policy of military aggression against Soviet Russia, but the valiant Red Army met and shattered every counter-revolutionary force hurled against it, until finally the idea penetrated the dense skulls of the capitalist statesmen that the Workers' and Peasants' government could not be conquered by force of arms. The question must be approached from another angle. Lloyd George had for three years been advocating a conference of European nations to deal with the economic reconstruction of Europe, to which Russia was to be invited. The bonds established between England and France during the World War could not be severed at one stroke, so the chauvinist policy of the French government prevented an independent move on the part of the British Premier.

The action of France at the Washington conference alienated considerable support from that nation and the attitude of Velichman decided the time was ripe for his proposal to be placed definitely before the world. France, as was to be expected, sabotaged the Genoa conference by vitiating the agenda drawn up at Cannes. Lloyd George, rather than face a break with France and endanger his own policy at home, submitted to the preposterous agenda.

The sacred treaty of Versailles was not to be molested. That treaty of clauses that could never have been carried out under the most favorable conditions conceivable, yet France was determined that not one clause should be changed. The representative of the Bloc Nationaliste, Poincare, never flinched in his determination to hold that treaty inviolate. He and his government represent powerful industrial and financial groups, chief of which are the Comité d'Etats (Foreign Affairs Committee) dominated by the Cremona magnate, M. Schneider, and the Comité des Houillères (Coal Mine Committee) of which Charles Lauréat, now ambassador to Berlin, has a dominant interest. M. Schneider is also one of the dominant individ-

uals in this group. The foundry industry of France has grown to such an extent that it is impossible to supply fuel for its consumption without access to the Ruhr region. Other than the Ruhr, there is no independent source of raw material that can be supplied only from Germany at anything approaching a reasonable expenditure. France knows that Germany can never meet the claims of the Versailles treaty, but insists upon Germany living in a permanent occupation of the Rhineland. FRANCE IS THE LAST COLONY THAT REALLY WANTS GERMAN.

Russia entered the conference with the announcement that any terms for genuine reconstruction of Europe, the economy would be acceptable to them, but that under no circumstances would they yield Communist control of the Russian government or betray the principles they had fought for in order to reach agreements with capitalist nations of Europe. The question of concessions in regard to government was handled in such a way by the representatives of the working class of Russia that no revolutionist, no matter how reasonable he might have been when the Geneva conference was announced, could possibly find fault with that course. Although the capitalist nations, without exception—England, France, Belgium, Italy and the host of smaller nations—insisted that private property rights should be re-established in Russia, there was no wavering on the part of the delegates from the Red Republic. All talk of going back to the old form of property relations were waved aside and the delegates frankly told that there could be no thought of a return to the old relations. The capitalist powers were given the opportunity to cure Russia, and to treat their normal people, such as they would receive in any other country, but there was no wavering on the part of the delegates from the Red Republic. The delegates from the working class were the only ones who were not deceived by the promises of the bourgeoisie.

CHICAGO TO AID SOVIET RUSSIA The vast destruction brought about by the seven years of war, intervention and counter-revolution in Russia raised the question of reconstruction in that country in the most serious manner. Of all the aid that is being given to Russia at the present, the technical aid of reconstruction is the most important and most valuable. Russia needs machinery and workers capable to handle it. To fill these needs, at the initiative of the Soviet Government, Societies for Technical Aid to Soviet Russia have been organized in the country. One of these societies is functioning in Chicago. It has a school, machine shop, garage, etc., where workers are being prepared technically in order that they may go to Russia and aid in the work of rebuilding the country. Since the Soviet was organized several groups already went to Russia. One group of automobile mechanics left just recently. Another is preparing to leave soon. In order to give every worker a chance to join the Society, the dues are very small, and naturally do not cover the expenses. Therefore the Society is forced to depend on income from entertainments. PERVERTING HISTORY

It is notorious that the history taught in schools is distorted in order to make the children think the thoughts of the ruling class of the nation...

In this country we are taught that George Washington was responsible for the Thirteen Colonies, establishing their independence of the British government...

Now comes the Board of Superintendents of Schools of New York State and declares that teaching of such knowledge might inspire the youngsters to express the same contempt for modern oppressive laws...

It is not considered advisable to teach children the facts concerning some of the founders of the United States, who although they were business men fighting a business man's war, had a healthy contempt for law and order as laid down by the British Crown...

A protest from another source on the question of teaching history in public schools was received last week. The annual convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Long Island, at Garden City, named a special committee to communicate with the Superintendents of Schools, the Board of Education and the Committee on Revision...

It is a fact of history that the much-married king, who murdered his wives for a pleasant pastime, was the founder of the Protestant Episcopal Church, otherwise known as the Church of England...

But then again the question of the influence of such knowledge upon young children must be taken into consideration. If children come to understand that all churches, whatever their origin, have their origin in worldly material conditions...

Why a God in the heavens are less prone to worship God on earth, in the guise of Capitalism and their tools, Presidents, Judges and Congressmen, therefore history must be perverted and children must be kept in ignorance in their youth, in order to ensure their submission to capitalism in their maturity...

SELF-APPOINTED LEADERS

The May 27 issue of The Worker, official organ of the Workers' Party of America, contains a manifesto on the question of the United Front of the working class of America, which is illuminating inasmuch as it exposes the childish conception of what constitutes a United Front...

Not even the plea of popularization of propaganda can excuse a statement that is contrary to the facts when dealing with the experience of the working class in this country...

It is difficult to determine just what the writer of the above quotation was trying to say. He talks as though what the workers are doing is to raise wages and later, taken away by the capitalist class. The facts in the case are that the wages of the working class never kept pace with the rise in the cost of living...

dividend demanded a rise in prices, but the wages the worker received for his labor was not absolutely reduced. To do with this rise in prices in the fact of the living statistics in the United States prove conclusively that it was not a rise in wages that caused a rise in the cost of living...

Least most inferiorly arise and ask why the cost of living is still high compared to 1914, which is the year of the commodity government labor statistics are compiled, we shall explain the phenomenon. There are only two things that can cause a permanent rise in the prices of commodities...

that it will submit to another gang of voluntarily subversive revolutionaries in the labor unions and the fakirs in the Workers' Party the real militant would have no choice, unless it be on the basis of intelligence. There are a few labor leaders of the old school who have a certain degree of intelligence and who have actually worked in the labor movement...

The United Front is something the vanguard of labor in this country has always striven for, but it is a real Union of the mass of organized labor and not a brazen attempt to rig the leadership of the United Front upon the movement.

WHY IS FRAYNE ENFORCING LUSK LAWS?

Hugh Frayne, an American Federation of Labor organizer, sits on an injurious and unjustly enforced and infamous Lusk law for the purpose of invading the "loyalty" of public school teachers in New York. There is not one worker with the slightest knowledge of the labor movement who supports the Lusk law...

Frayne's associates on the council are avowed servants of capitalism and are consistently ignorant and vicious. In their testaments we see the reaction of their minds have become so warped that they embarrass even the journalistic apologists of his capitalist masters...
