With deep anguish Comrade Ghosh perceived that it would be a calamity if the people in this country, and in other countries too, by seeing the unprincipled and unethical activities and conduct of the pseudo-lefts, pseudo communists, turn away from leftism and communism. He showed that the toiling masses would have to understand the reasons of the crisis in politics, economics and culture-ethics-morality. 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# Com. Shibdas Ghosh's thoughts and teachings create great enthusiasm

## Thousands Visit the Quotation Exhibition at Pragnanananda Hall, Calcutta

The Central Committee of our party, SUCI adjured us this year, on the occasion of 5th August, Comrade Shibdas Ghosh Memorial Day, to learn and re-learn his thoughts and teachings in order to build ourselves as worthy disciples of the great departed leader and carry his message to every corner of the country.

As a part of the programme the Calcutta District Committee of SUCI, organised a Quotation Exhibition at Pragnanananda Bhawan near Sealdah. The Quotation Exhibition was inaugurated on 29th July at 6 p.m. and was continued upto 1st August.

The exhibition was inaugurated with the song composed on the great leader and was sung by the DYO Music Squad. The exhibition was inaugurated by Comrade Sukomal Dasgupta, Secretary, West Bengal State committee, SUCI.

In his inaugural speech Comrade Dasgupta said that Comrade Shibdas Ghosh is no more amongst us but he has left behind a vast treasure of knowledge which will not only show us the path in our struggle to bring emancipation of Indian proletariat, but will guide us even for many decades to come after revolution. Not only that his thoughts and teachings will show path to the world proletarian revolutionary movement as well, Comrade Dasgupta emphatically said.

So far, we have been able to publish only a little portion of his vast treasure of knowledge, Comrade Dasgupta continued, and these quotations displayed here are just a negligible few—as if we have picked up a few pebbles from the shore of his inexhaustible sea of knowledge. In his pursuit to build up SUCI, the genuine working class party on our soil, he has concretised, elaborated and enriched and brought to a new height the

understanding of Marxism-Leninism.

Comrade Ghosh has taught us that we cannot learn Marxism-Leninism by copying—we can acquire comprehensive knowledge only by applying it in concrete conditions. We must acquire proletarian culture, ethics and morality. We shall have to wage relentless struggle to free ourselves from petty individual interest, we must struggle continuously to identify our self-interest with that of social interest—by this and by this alone we can become true communists, said Comrade Dasgupta.

Through scientific analysis Comrade Ghosh has exposed the real face of fascism. He has shown that the Two party system is a variant of fascist rule, a variant of fascism. Fascism does not come only in the form of ruthless autocratic rule, repression and oppression—it has another face, in the form of persuasion, under cover of so-called radical slogan, socialist vocabulary.

We must remember his caution that in today's world when social democracy has thoroughly exposed itself it is those pseudo-communist parties who wave reduced themselves to national communist parties, who wave red banner, chant revolutionary slogans, will become the last prop of defence of capitalism and will be instrumental to bring fascism, waving red banner, if they can combine fanaticism and blindness with apparent militancy.

Comrade Ghosh has taught us that man does not tolerate oppression for long—one day they will rise in protest, express resentment, rise in revolt—but revolt and revolution are not one and the same thing—one is just an outburst of resentment against oppression, exploitation the other is an upsurge for fundamental change. But fundamental change which alone can end exploitation

and end the miseries of the people cannot be brought about if the path is not correct. So it is imperative that the correct path is to be determined.

Again Comrade Ghosh has taught us that we want to solve our problems, we want to bring revolution—but it is not all—what is of greatest importance is whether to achieve it we perform our own responsibilities. We must build ourselves so as to be worthy organisers, worthy leaders of the people to lead them to the path of revolution, not to fetch petty individual interest, said Comrade Dasgupta.

Comrade Dasgupta then continued to say that the party Comrade Shibdas Ghosh started to build brick by brick in 1948 with a handful of compatriots defying all odds and adversities has now spread its activities in 18 states of India. People see for themselves that SUCI is made of different metal. In greater number they are rallying behind our party. People are watching with admiration the movements we are organising, all on our own strength, on people's various demands. We have the future. People want to fight against injustice—we are to show them the correct path, the path laid down by Comrade Shibdas Ghosh. So we must carry his thoughts to every corner of the country.

In an emotion-rousing voice Comrade Dasgupta concluded by saying that let us learn and relearn, as has been urged by the Central Committee of our party headed by Comrade Nihar Mukherjee a close Comrade in arms of Comrade Shibdas Ghosh, the thoughts and teachings of our great leader, teacher and guide to build ourselves as his worthy disciples. If we can do that, only then, shall we be able to pay our real homage to him.

It started to rain in torrents just when

Comrade Dasgupta began his inaugural speech, and the rain continued for more than one hour. Not a single person who assembled there on this occasion, standing outside the hall under bare sky did move away—they defied the natural calamity, all fully drenched—listened with rapt attention to the speech—in the spirit worthy of the disciples of the great leader of the proletariat.

At the front of the Hall a gate all in red was erected. Quotations, beautifully written on cardboards were placed on the walls of the Hall and as there was shortage of space, in the middle of the Hall was erected a temporary wall to provide room for more boards. At the dais was placed a portrait of Comrade Shibdas Ghosh, flower bedecked.

When one goes through the quotations one wonders how deeply he understood all the problems, how profound was his wisdom! How boldly he stood and defended the nobility of Communism, "Communist moral is fundamentally different from humanistic moral values both in content and character. In the annals of human society humanism is not the last word. It is undoubtedly, the most lively air that the oppressive bourgeois thinking is capable of producing. But the march of progress of society does not stop there and hence, the sense of moral values does not find its zenith in humanism. Communism begins where humanism ends. Only on the ashes of humanist moral values can communist moral values grow and prosper".

Will only understanding Marxism-Leninism intellectually help us to attain our goal? No, certainly not. He said, "All Marxists and men of profound wisdom and men of erudition know it very well that man's emotional relation bears

strong influence on his character and culture. If a man understands revolutionary theories only intellectually but fails to realise them on the level of emotion then it cannot influence his character, intellectual ability, understanding. Understanding of Marxism remains at the surface level of intellect and can be used only for academic exercises like writing, discussing or giving lectures—but it is of no avail in influencing character".

But we must never forget that "to a revolutionary emotion, pain, tenderness, affection, love, sense of duty and responsibility, anger and hate—all this carry a meaning, a significance. To a revolutionary these are not mere personal affairs. At least, one, who is a revolutionary, a Marxist-Leninist and who realises what revolution is, should understand that the expression of these emotional faculties in him, merely for personal reasons, does not carry any sense at all. If these are for personal reasons then he is not a revolutionary of the first rank".

But how to know as to whether one has become such a revolutionary, one has grasped Marxism-Leninism correctly? He said, "The acid test as to whether a man has correctly realised Marxism-Leninism is whether a high cultural-ethical standard is being reflected in his life".

For, "The kernel, the living soul of any lofty ideal, any philosophy or any worthy ideology lies in its cultural, ethical and aesthetic standard. Marxism is a lofty revolutionary ideal. Its kernel, the living soul of this noblest revolutionary ideal also is ingrained in its cultural and moral values."

Choosing a genuine revolutionary party or building such one and strengthen it with all might is an all important task for the emancipation of the

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# Massive Protest Demonstration to West Bengal Governor against ESMO

Calcutta :

The West Bengal State Committee of the SUCI organised a massive protest demonstration against the promulgation of the Essential Services Maintenance Ordinance 1981 by the Central Congress (I) Government on August 5 last. The demonstration was led by leaders like Comrade Ashutosh Banerjee, Comrade Fatick Ghosh and Comrade Chhaya Mukherjee. In spite of the prior intimation it was found that the Governor was absent and so the memorandum was placed to the Deputy Secretary to the Governor for transmission to him. The salient points of the memorandum as submitted to the Governor are given below :

.....It is an incontrovertible fact that Indian capitalism as a part of the crisis-ridden world capitalism, is passing through the third phase of intense general crisis and thus being crippled is adopting authoritarian measures one after another, but instead of bringing abatement they only accentuate the crisis further. So, it is not accidental that a vast country like India having rich minerals, forest, and natural resources as also huge man-power including the technical know-how of thousands and thousands of scientists, technicians, leaving aside the question of initiating and sustaining industrial revolution, modernising and mechanising agriculture, creating employment opportunities thereby, far from augmenting the productive capacity is even keeping the existing installed capacity idle. That is why, closure, lock-outs, lay-offs have become almost daily occurrence, sickness in industrial field endemic. The entire agricultural sector has been left to the mercy of the jotedars, hoarders, profiteers and the evil chain of vested

interest. And for all these maladies, the exploited working people can surely be not held responsible in any way, the responsibility should lie fairly and squarely on this crisis-ridden capitalist productive system.

But, in order to serve the interest of the ruling capitalist class, your

Government is increasing on the one hand, the tax burdens on the people, enhancing prices of essential commodities including transport fares, eroding the real wages by devaluing money, protecting and encouraging all evil and corrupt practices of business community just to pass the buck on to the people on

the other hand, is crushing ruthlessly all democratic and legitimate movements, trampling under foot all democratic rights and norms, moral values and ethics, squeezing further relative neutrality of administration, independence of judiciary, autonomy of educational institutions over and above promulgating ordinances and enacting laws that take away the last vestiges

of democratic rights and values in a bid to bring about all-out fascism in the country.

We, on behalf of the toiling and exploited people of our country strongly demand of you and through you, the Government of India to withdraw forthwith the most undemocratic and anti-people Essential Services Maintenance Ordinance, 1981, promulgated very recently.

Comrade Ghosh brilliantly identified the ingredients needed to organise successful revolution and strove to attain the same. Comrade Lenin had shown that without a correct revolutionary theory there could be no revolution and by applying Marxism in analysing every phenomenon in Russia he showed that under the leadership of the working class, the landless and poor peasants, the petty bourgeois and other sections of the toiling masses would and could accomplish socialist revolution. Comrade Ghosh pointed out again and again that when Lenin underlined the importance of revolutionary theory, he included the question of proletarian culture covering all aspects of life which the revolutionary workers must acquire and carry forward to accomplish revolution. Comrade Ghosh further elaborated concretely these revolutionary tasks in the post-Lenin period and through struggles covering all aspects of life and delving deeply into every branch of epistemology attained through realisation of Marxism and has handed down to us a treasure house of knowledge, the correct base political line of the Indian revolution and the correct revolutionary working class party, the SUCI which, by keeping the dialectical process living within it, will act as the vanguard detachment of working class in every movement, every struggle in the country.

Comrade Nihar Mukherjee further said that Comrade Shibdas Ghosh has placed our party, the SUCI, on the base of higher proletarian culture and ethics. So long giving precedence to the interest of the party and revolution over the interest of the individual, that is, subjugating individual interest to the interest of party and revolution

was considered to be the highmark of communist character. Facing the problems of acute selfishness, self-centred attitude, ego-centrism and apathy to social problems bred among the people by the moribund capitalism, Comrade Ghosh has raised the concept of communist character to a new height and has set the example of a higher standard of communist morality through his own exemplary revolutionary life and character. He has shown that those who are to attain advanced communist character today, will have to completely identify their individual interest with social interest, the interest of the party and revolution. Showing the clear difference he said that when we are able to surrender individual interest to the interest of party and revolution, it shows that even then there is existence of individual interest. But when merging and complete identification of individual interest with social interest becomes possible then individual interest does not have any separate existence from the toiling masses and their revolutionary party.

Comrade Nihar Mukherjee added that those who, armed with Comrade Shibdas Ghosh's teachings, want to bring about radical transformation of the society, will have to have the firm conviction that the present society has nothing more or better to offer. Comrade Ghosh has shown that the main task today is to build up the movements of students, youths, women, peasants, workers—the toiling masses—in a manner conducive to revolution, and to forge the instruments of struggle, the people's committees, and through those only by emergence of people's own alternative political power in this manner can the present exploitative system be smashed. Therefore,

there is only one true way of showing respect to Comrade Ghosh: to realise that only the party workers cannot organise the revolution, all sections of the toiling masses will have to participate in the revolution actively because there is no other way of escape from the problems and misery of life. Therefore, they have to view and understand the problems on the basis of working class outlook, Marxism-Leninism. Marx said that in order to change the world, the workers must change themselves first; today the decadent morality, sense of values of moribund capitalism is influencing us and trying to degrade us all the time—in order to free the toiling masses from these, study and cultivation of learning, sciences and knowledge will have to be intensified so that the toiling masses can acquire proletarian world outlook and arm themselves for playing active role in bringing about true transformation of the society. You need not take this as gospel truth because I am saying this, you yourself analyse. Is there any other course open?

It is to be understood clearly why Smt. Gandhi's Government is adopting one after another repressive measures and more and more concentrating power in the hands of police and bureaucracy—whither they are trying to take the country through these? Smt. Gandhi has had to admit that the economy of the country is tottering today. In order to bolster up this crisis-ridden capitalist economy Smt. Gandhi's Government serving the aggregate interest of the ruling bourgeois class, through succession of deficit budgets, increase in taxation and price hikes—is on the one hand giving relief to the capitalists, the bourgeoisie through various subsidies, incentives and price hikes

while on the other, is passing the whole burden of the crisis of capitalist economy on to the shoulders of the toiling masses. In order that the masses may not rise up in united protest, democratic rights are being curtailed one by one, to the workers bonus is being restricted and the new ordinance taking away the right to strike has been promulgated so that the ruling class gets away unscathed. The central as well as the state governments—not only the Congress (I) run Governments but also the "left" ministries in the states of West Bengal, Kerala and Tripura headed by the CPI(M)—are parties to this bourgeois design and conspiracy. Not only that, on most of the occasions when the Central Government raised excise duty on petrol, diesel etc. the West Bengal Government also followed suit by increasing the duty at a lower rate but raised a hue and cry over the issue of imposition of taxes by the Central Government. The "Left Front" Government has increased the expenditure on police and taxation in successive annual budgets, has increased the bus fare more than once during its rule of the last four years. Have you ever heard them saying that through the fiscal, taxation and price policy, through the authoritarian measures, the Central Government is passing the burden of crisis in capitalist economy on to the masses and safeguarding the interest of the ruling bourgeoisie? Had they been true leftists, would they not have focussed on the issue from this class-angularity and exposed this bourgeois design?

Is there not a burning necessity today of building up united left and democratic movement against the all-out fascist moves of the Central Government

so that the democratic rights could be restored, safeguarded and expanded? When, with the fascist objective of concentrating more power in the hands of the executive the clamour for adopting a presidential form of government was being raised in the country with active encouragement of the Central Government, we appealed to all the left parties for building up joint movement against the same. But there was no response.

Comrade Shibdas Ghosh has taught us that because of its development in the era of crisis of moribund capitalism and proletarian revolution, Indian capitalism has grown with a reformist and compromising character. It was not possible for the Indian bourgeoisie to play the bold revolutionary role the bourgeoisie played in the western countries in the days of industrial revolution. Lenin said that cultural revolution precedes the technical revolution. The rightist bourgeois leadership of the freedom movement in India, because of their fear complex of revolution, neglected the duty of bringing about a cultural revolution to precede the bourgeois democratic revolution through doing away with the religious superstitions, casteism, communalism, regionalism - parochialism and other feudal traits to democratise society. Comrade Shibdas Ghosh perceived this tragedy even at a tender age and anguish and pain of this filled his days and nights. His knowledge or thought was not merely acquired from books, he sought out truth through struggles and confronting concrete problems. Comrade Ghosh taught us that not only the bourgeois parties, but even those calling themselves leftists, Marxist-Leninists in this country did not unfurl the banner of cultural movement for democratisation of the society and stand up against casteism, regionalism, parochialism neither

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during the freedom movement, nor after the independence. Why? Because the correct understanding of Marxism required to grasp this task was not present in them. It is not that the CPI leaders were dishonest to start with. But unless correct dialectical process is used in forming and developing the party, unless there is scientific Marxist outlook and understanding and correct methodological approach along with honesty and dedication, a party can never become a true Marxist party and perform its historical tasks. The revolutionary leaders who organised revolution in practice in different ages and Comrade Ghosh too, have stressed that the correct process and correct base political line are the cardinal points; without these, only honesty and dedication cannot suffice. They never said that they were correct because they had so much mass support. We find in history that at times the masses have flocked behind and supported extreme reactionary ideologies even. Does it prove that those ideologies were socially progressive? Not at all. In Germany and Italy, fascism deceived and misguided large part of the people in supporting it and could hold the mass support for considerable time although fascism is the biggest enemy to progress and human civilisation. Therefore, only mass support cannot be the yardstick.

Comrade Shibdas Ghosh, through deep insight and correct Marxist understanding, has made a comprehensive analysis of the form which fascism is taking today. He has shown that in this third phase of intense general

crisis of world capitalism, all capitalist countries, whether they are advanced or relatively backward, are more and more prone to move towards fascism in order to bolster up moribund crisis-ridden capitalism. Comrade Ghosh showed that fascism is not just naked dictatorship. He showed that fascism has a dual character. It rules through brutal repression coupled with sanction and support from a large misguided portion of the people whom it deceives by its cloak of progressiveness, by so-called radical slogans. That is why the radical, rather than the conservative section of the bourgeoisie is instrumental in bringing about fascism. This deceptive character of fascism is to be discerned and understood.

It is a matter of deep regret that the so called communist parties in our country failed in this regard. When the Congress (R) led by Smt. Gandhi was consolidating its position and moving towards fascism through various measures under the cloak of radical slogans, the CPI was hand in glove with her and the CPI(M) supported her. It was none but the Polit Bureau of CPI(M) which discovered healthy anti-imperialist anti-monopoly and progressive trend in the policies pursued by Smt. Indira Gandhi's Government. The CPI(M) described the measures like abolition of privy purse and bank nationalisation to be radical and progressive and hailed the victory of Sri V. V. Giri, Smt. Gandhi's presidential candidate as a victory of popular and democratic forces. During the Emergency, the CPI(M) accorded tacit approval to the Emergency measures and in a conciliatory memorandum submitted

to Smt. Gandhi even supported her fascistic 20 point programme!

Did they not help Indira Gandhi to gain a progressive image by all these? Could Indira Gandhi have succeeded so easily if these so called leftists had not painted her as progressive?

Comrade Nihar Mukherjee, appealed to these parties: criticise us if you like, but do so dispassionately and without rancour. Fascism, once established firmly, would spare nobody, not even you. If all the democratic forces in Germany had united against Hitler, could he have succeeded? Not only on the issue of switchover to presidential form, on the Assam question too we appealed to these "lefts" for jointly developing country-wide movement against the Central Government, but there was no response. On the question of the recent deaths of Irish revolutionary prisoners fighting for their political rights in British prison too, we appealed to these leftists to build up jointly a strong wave of protest and force the Indira Government to sever all relations with the British Commonwealth, but again they did not respond. Like the Irish, we too suffered during British rule. With great respect we recall the martyrdom of Jatin Das by starvation in British jail. And now not one but eight Irishmen have courted martyrdom in similar fashion and yet our independent sovereign Government has not even put in a protest. On the contrary, President Sanjiva Reddy and Rajiv Gandhi along with his wife have gone to the wedding feast of Prince Charles of England, taking a Kashmir carpet as gift! Is this not a display of slavish mentality? Yet these so-called leftists who have not responded to our

call for a movement on this issue, accuse us of slavish mentality when we protest against the anti-people policy of the "Left Front" Government in West Bengal of doing away with English in the primary stage of education—the English language on the basis of which the national awakening came to this country, the English language which was and is still conducive to growth and advancement of our respective mother-tongues in the country! These so-called left parties forget that fighting against British imperialist domination has nothing to do with fighting against English language as such. Most probably they also forget Stalin's remarkable proposition that language has no class character.

The ordinance promulgated by Indira Government banning strikes is but the beginning. Other draconian measures are in the offing. "We appeal to the workers of all the leftist parties: let us form a broad-based front for combating the evil of fascism by rallying not only the leftists and the left-oriented masses, but also the numerous non-left honest, right-thinking people, for if fascism comes it will spare nobody.

Whenever the question of organising a movement comes up, Promode Babu, West Bengal State Secretary of the CPI(M), either says that the SUCI is a disruptive force or that the SUCI does not abide by code of conduct. But see, the SUCI is not in the "Left Front" in this state. And yet, during the recent municipal elections, the constituents of the "Left Front" fought against one another in many a place, went to the extent of physical assault mostly by the CPI(M), and even sided with the Congress(I). Is this not true? When attacks are being mounted daily on the leftist workers and all mass movements are being crushed by this very "Left Front" Government, we hear from their mouths that the SUCI does not observe any code of con-

duct! This is the method of Goebbels, of trying to pass often a lie as truth by repeating it. Comrade Ghosh said that slanders cannot block the path of truth, because falsehood cannot deceive all for ever. Our founder General Secretary Comrade Shibdas Ghosh has set our party, the SUCI, on this firm conviction. Today SUCI is the only party which upholds the banner of democratic mass movement reflecting the interest of the people. Comrade workers of the left parties, the SUCI has again and again appealed for forming a united left front on the basis of a definite programme and code of conduct. But the CPI(M) has advocated loose, issue-based arrangement instead of a front. Even when, the CPI was undivided and the appeasing of the bourgeoisie by such pseudo-communists was not naked as today, Comrade Shibdas Ghosh showed by analysis that after the branded bourgeois parties have been thoroughly exposed in mass eyes, it is the parties who call themselves communists but are actually social democrats that can, by waving red flags and combining blind allegiance of the cadres with militancy, act as saviours to the crisis-ridden capitalism, as last props to capitalism as its doom approaches. I request the cadres-supporters of such left parties to deeply ponder: has not this analysis been fully corroborated by facts and events today? Comrades, many among you are in politics being attracted by the nobility of Marxism-Leninism, you pine for revolution. Will you not ensure that your genuine affinity for Marxism-Leninism, your allegiance to revolution, your feeling for the proletarian class and masses are not led astray by the wrong politics of the leadership of your parties?

It is our considered assessment that the parties like the CPI and the CPI(M) are petty bourgeois social democratic parties who participate in mass movements with reformist

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 outlook and utilise such movements for just bringing about some reforms within the existing capitalist framework and for making gains in parliamentary politics. We view such forces as the compromising forces between labour and capital. In Marxist concept, there is an aspect of struggle even in unity with such forces. What should be the form of such struggle? When we were in united struggle with CPI(M) and others against the Congress we always protected this struggling unity like the apple of an eye but never forget, since we were united, to conduct

ideological struggle against the partners of the front for a single moment. With all humility, we can say that we have always upheld the Marxist norm of unity-struggle-unity in joint movements. While we were in united fronts with parties like the CPI and the CPI(M), while we have fought the Congress unitedly, we have at the same time conducted ideological struggles against such compromising left forces, because without this, the compromising

forces cannot be isolated, the revolutionary line cannot be established before the masses and the mass movements cannot be developed in a manner conducive to revolution. Therefore, as a serious Marxist party, even while organising united movements, it is our bounden duty to conduct uncompromising ideological struggles. It is worthwhile to recall that Comrade Lenin, even while fighting against the Czar unitedly with the Cadet Party, conducted ideological struggle against the Cadets. Later on, even while in united movement with the Mensheviks, Lenin fought them ideologically to expose their wrong politics. Without this, would the Great November Revolution have been possible? Comrade Stalin opined afterwards that without exposing the compromising forces ideologically and isolating them, the revolution could never have reached successful culmination. We have to remember these teachings of history.

Marxist knowledge that we have inherited from our beloved leader, teacher and guide Comrade Shibdas Ghosh is the fruit of his life long struggles. It is not possible to discuss about it adequately even in a number of meetings taken together, not to speak of just one meeting. Also, it is not a subject just for discussion or talking about. Comrade Ghosh has handed down to us an invincible weapon for the success of Indian revolution—an epistemological category

covering all aspects of life, Marxist science and knowledge; a correct revolutionary base political line of the proletariat with concrete guidelines on strategy and tactics, on how to differentiate the enemies and friends of the Indian revolution and on all aspects of conducting mass movements towards creating people's own alternative political power as a precursor to revolution; and this revolutionary party, the SUCI, forged with his own hands. It is our duty to take guidance from these, develop this party from strength to further strength and prepare our-

### **Comrade Sachin Banerjee's Speech**

Comrade Sachin Banerjee said that since 1976, every year on 5th August, we commemorate the passing away of Comrade Shibdas Ghosh, the great leader of the proletariat. For us, this is not a formal, ritualistic show of respect to Comrade Ghosh. On this occasion our party workers study Comrade Ghosh's teachings covering all aspects of life, learn and re-learn his teachings, conduct a campaign of sale of books and pamphlets embodying Comrade Ghosh's thought and organise exhibition of quotations from his works. In this way, the

party workers enhance this knowledge and spread Comrade Ghosh's thought. Comrade Ghosh was a seeker of truth. When by deep analysis he perceived the painful truth that there is no real communist party in the country, he came forward with a handful of revolutionary compatriots to form the SUCI, the only true communist party on the Indian soil. Obstacles or hindrances could not budge him. This stupendously bold venture, in the face of numerous established parties, was considered by many to be an act of madness. With ceaseless untiring toil, Comrade Ghosh picked up and developed cadres one by one and would rush to a place on the information that someone there had enthusiasm and promise. At the same time, whenever there was despair among any of the comrades, he used to invigorate him and rekindle his enthusiasm. If there would be any doubt as to whether we would be able to accomplish the task Comrade Ghosh's attitude was: We have to stick to the task since, we have perceived this to be the true course; if we fail and die on the street, we would deem that was necessary in the interest of revolution in India.

Step by step, Comrade Ghosh, through strenuous struggles built up the edifice of the party, the SUCI. In the process, he dealt with all problems covering every aspect of life in the post-Lenin period on the basis of Marxist science and methodology, concretised, elaborated and enriched Marxism and raised the Marxist understanding on many aspects to a new height. For example, when Khrushchev's report to the 20th Congress of the CPSU was being applauded by the communist parties the world over, Comrade

Ghosh perceived the revisionist content of Khrushchev's policy and said that by this the flood gates of revisionism would be opened. Subsequently, this was corroborated by history. There are many such issues on which Comrade Ghosh enriched Marxism.

Comrade Ghosh used to lay great stress on the question of culture and ethics. He used to say that the kernel, the living soul of any lofty ideal or philosophy lies in its cultural, ethical and aesthetic standard. He used to say that if one had a low cultural standard he was not a true communist. Previously, it was considered to be the height of communist morality to place the party interest above the individual interest. Comrade Ghosh raised communist ethics to a newer height and showed that to be a good communist one's individual interest was to be merged with the interest of the party and revolution.

Today, there are attempts to take the country towards fascism. The ruling bourgeoisie, unable to rule by the ordinary laws, are more and more taking recourse to repressive measures and ordinances. The more they try to solve the problems of crisis-ridden capitalism, the more the problems increase. They will not be able to solve the problems within the present capitalist system. There is a golden opportunity for building up mass movements and for this a countrywide left and democratic front is a burning necessity. But today not only the Congress Governments at the centre and the states, even the CPI(M)-led 'left' governments in West Bengal, Kerala and Tripura are serving the ruling capitalists. In West Bengal, after assumption of office by the "Left Front" Government, one

of the first things that the CPI(M) Chief Minister, Jyoti Basu, did was to give assurance to the capitalists that the new ministry would not harm them: Ashoke Mitra, the CPI(M) Finance Minister, has openly stated: Can Congress assure the capitalists of stability in this state? No. Only the CPI(M), which has hold over the working class, can provide stability to the capitalists in a left-oriented state like West Bengal.

The "Left Front" Government is serving the capitalists well in West Bengal. They think that when Indira would fail, they would emerge as better protectors of capitalist interest on the national scene. Comrade Shibdas Ghosh had clearly foreseen this possibility and cautioned us against it.

Not only that, this "Left Front" Government is not organising any movements; they are actually crushing with brutal ferocity all movements of the toiling people. There are glaring instances galore of this—police firing on the striking Calcutta Port workers, attacks on the Santaldih power plant workers, brutal, inhuman all-out attacks on war footing on the hapless refugees at Marichjhanpi and the barbarous attack on the massive protest demonstration by the SUCI on June 15, 1979 at Calcutta, to name just a few. The CPI(M) and its associates are trying to break the backbone of all mass movements.

Repeated appeals by our party, the SUCI, to these "left" parties for building up joint movements against the fascist moves of the Central Government headed by Smt. Gandhi have been in vain. Therefore, the SUCI has come forward single-banded and is trying to develop mass movements in different parts of the country to the best of its strength and ability.

Revolution will have to wait until a revolutionary party emerges with necessary strength to lead it".
